## **Ho Kim**

Ho Kim(PhD) is a professor of the Department of Public Health Science, Graduate School of Public Health, Seoul National University in Korea. He was the last Dean of the Graduate School of Public Health, Seoul National University.

He has been conducting research on the impact of air pollution and climate change on human health for more than twenty years, with a special focus on the long-term health effects of ambient air pollution and methodology developments, especially in East Asian countries. His current topics include health impacts of greenness and urban environment in various health outcomes including kidney diseases, and mental problems.

His scientific training includes an MS in Statistics from the Seoul National University, Korea and a PhD in Biostatistics from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, USA.

Ho Kim has been a member of ISEE since 1999 and served as a co-chair of the local organizing committee of 2019 ISEE ISES AC (Asian Chapter) conference in Daegu, Korea. He is a former president of the Korean Society for Health Informatics and Statistics, is the current vice-presidents of the Korean Society for Epidemiology and of the Korean Society of Climate Change. He is also an elected fellow of the National Academy of Medicine of Korea and of the Korea
